About the Consortium

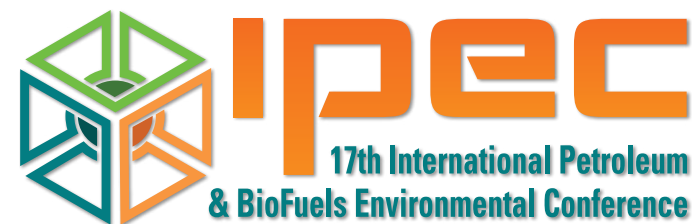
